Saiga Antelope



Why in News?

• The IUCN (International Union for Conservation of Nature) Red List has recently reclassified the status of the Saiga Antelope (Saiga tatarica) from Critically Endangered to Near Threatened.


 This significant update reflects positive conservation efforts and offers a hopeful outlook for the survival of the Saiga antelope species.



Key Facts about Saiga Antelope

- The Saiga antelope is a large, nomadic, migratory herbivore that lives across the Eurasian Steppe.
- It's found in Kazakhstan, Mongolia, the Russian Federation, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan.









The Saiga has two subspecies:

- 1. Saiga tatarica tatarica (found in most of the range) and
- 2. Saiga tatarica mongolica (found only in Mongolia).

★hey have an unusual hanging nose, which makes them look like a camel, although they are goat- sized, and male saigas have horns

Typical habitat consists of flat open areas covered with low-growing vegetation, allowing animals to run quickly.



Decline in Saiga Population

- The Saiga faced a drastic decline in its population by more than 95% within a decade after 1991.
- The decline was primarily due to poaching for the species' meat and horn. The horn is used in Chinese Traditional Medicine.
 - 2015, a major epidemic killed more than 200,000 animals, which was a blow to the species' promising recovery.



Conservation:

- €onservation efforts have led to a positive change in the global Red List status of the Saiga antelope.
- Kazakhstan has shown commendable leadership in species recovery,
- The CMS (Convention on the Conservation of Migratory Species) of Wild Animals has facilitated cooperation among governments for the conservation of the Saiga antelope.
- The Saiga antelope population has soared to over 1.9 million, in the 2023 census.
- IUCN) Red List has recently reclassified the status of the Saiga Antelope (Saiga tatarica) from Critically Endangered to Near Threatened.








IUCN Red List-categories

THE RED LIST CATEGORIES



Extinct (EX): no reasonable doubt that the last individual has died

Extinct in the Wild (EW): known only to survive in captivity, cultivation or well outside its natural range

Critically Endangered (CR): facing extremely high risk of extinction in the wild

Endangered (EN): facing a very high risk of extinction in the wild,

Vulnerable (VU): facing a high risk of extinction in the wild.

Near Threatened (NT): close to qualifying, or likely to qualify for a threatened category in the near future Least Concern (LC): population is stable enough that it is unlikely to face extinction in the near future

Data Deficient (DD): not enough information on abundance or distribution to estimate its risk of extinction
